With the small amount of porous soil in a bonsai pot, water not only drains quickly but also evaporates quickly. I took a long weekend off to visit relatives, my lawn pump shut down and I lost a significant amount of my trees and plants. So, beware. Weather can (and probably will) get some of your trees eventually. We have avoided hurricanes so far. Hurricanes may damage bonsai not only from wind and flying debris but from too much water over a long period which may allow the initiation of root rot, fungus diseases, molds and other unpleasant things. 'Thoughts' from Edgar Hund

The bonsai experience includes pleasurable activities of nursing a tree from a beginner plant thru progressive stages of bonsai development to a time when the owner decides that his tree is complete and fulfills his needs and expectations. This journey can be short or long depending on any number of factors and conditions. As the tree progresses, so does the master until both reach expected levels of completion and competence. To get there requires the appreciation of the art and science of bonsai and the confidence of subject mastery. It requires patience, perseverance and above all, hands-on practice.

With that in mind, the Board proposes to get the membership involved in the process by direct participation. This would involve presentations by the member of his tree's characteristics, a proposed or desired plan of action and the sharing of that with the membership. As this is expected to be a learning experience, expertise is not a prerequisite. There is virtually unlimited information on all aspects of bonsai in many forms of the media and in our own library. If you have never presented, we the members will help in any way necessary. Bring your hands and desire. A Q&A session will take place during our September meeting to explore member thoughts and to develop individual programs. Beginner members can be assigned mentors to aid in the process.

Of course, before any storm hits, move your bonsai to the ground or into a protected area to keep them from being damaged. Propagation is pretty much over for the year. Cuttings from tropical plants that I stuck almost a month ago have not rooted yet when, in April and May, they would have rooted in just a few days. Enjoy the remainder of summer. Fall and winter are on the way!
